

PART – TIME STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Part time enrollment offers students the flexibility to take classes when they fit into their schedule. Whether you're looking to take 1 or 2 classes online to solve a scheduling problem, take a class not offered at the regular school or looking for a great way to introduce yourself to online learning as preparation for college, WVL can assist you in all of these areas with part time enrollment. NOSD residents currently attending Ozaukee High School simply need to discuss their options with their school counselor.

Please use the table below to identify the appropriate application method if you are not currently attending the Northern Ozaukee High School. In all cases you will want to connect with our Enrollment Coordinator.

HOMESCHOOL OPTIONS

Wisconsin state statute §118.53 now allows any homeschooled student to take up to 2 classes at any public school (including WVL). Acceptance into a class would be based upon class space availability and meeting the minimum standard requirements for attending the course. Other than any applicable fees that may apply to any student taking certain courses; this option costs nothing for homeschooled families.

To apply for up to 2 classes, please complete and submit the [Student Profile & Course Selection Form](#). You will also need to provide confirmation of being registered with DPI, as being enrolled in a home-based private education program (homeschooling), and provide evidence of meeting the minimum standard required for the course(s) being requested. Semester enrollment into the class or classes you wish to attend is preferred.

COURSE OPTIONS

Any student attending a public school in Wisconsin is eligible to participate in the State's new Course Options program. Students remain enrolled in their regular school for the majority of their classes while taking 1 - 2 classes online at Wisconsin Virtual Learning. To apply, complete and submit the forms below to our office no later than 6 weeks before the start of the semester.

Families of students enrolled at a public school that is not part of the WVL PT Partner Program (see below), but missed the deadline can sign a tuition contract with the NOSD to take classes at WVL. TUITION

Students who either missed the Course Options deadline or attend a private or parochial school may still attend WVL on a part-time basis. However, tuition will be required unless you are a Northern Ozaukee School District resident. WVL PT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

Both public and private schools are encouraged to register for Wisconsin Virtual Learning's PT Partnership Program. Students enrolled in partner schools are not subject to the deadlines in the State's Course Options program. Schools and families benefit by enjoying reduced tuition rates compared to those charged under the State's Course Options program. In exchange, partner schools agree to promote our partnership and opportunities it affords amongst students and their families.

This option costs nothing for families unless the full-time private school decides to charge the cost back to the family. Public schools should not use this option and charge the cost back to the family to avoid participating in the State's part-time open enrollment program. Families of students enrolled at a private school, which is not part of our PT Partner Program can sign a tuition contract with the NOSD to take classes at WVL.

FAQ

How does the Partnership Work?

- School Districts enter into an agreement with Wisconsin Virtual Learning and appoint a contact Advisor.
- The contact Advisor provides the Course Selection and Profile Information forms to the interested student /family and approves the courses selected.
- The student completes and submits the required forms to the WVL Enrollment Coordinator, prior to the beginning of the new semester. Enrolled based upon class size availability.

Who is eligible to participate in the PT Partnership Program?

- Our program is open to any student attending a partnering Wisconsin high school. Middle school student with unique situations will also be considered.

When does orientation occur and how is log-in information provided for students and parents?

- The student and the family will be notified of their acceptance into the part time program and matched with an (SLA) Student Learning Advocate.
- The SLA will guide them through the next steps of the enrollment process that include providing computer access / log in ID's, scheduling and linking them with the virtual orientation sessions.

Roles to Achieve Successful Course Completion

- The partnership between the school and family is very important for student's to be successful in the virtual learning environment. Success is achieved when parents supervise and monitor the day-to-day progress of the student. The resident district Student Advisor and SLA work together with the teacher and student in order to achieve successful course completion outcomes. Communication is key and encouraged.
